

ROLE OF THE TAMIL NADU FREE BUS TRAVEL SCHEME IN ENHANCING PUBLIC WELFARE AND SOCIAL INCLUSION: A SECONDARY DATA ANALYSIS

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Abstract

The Free Bus Travel Scheme for Women introduced by the Government of Tamil Nadu in 2021 is a landmark welfare initiative aimed at improving women's mobility, economic security, and social inclusion. The scheme allows women to travel free of cost in ordinary government buses across the state. This study examines the role of the scheme in enhancing public welfare and promoting social inclusion through a secondary data analysis of government reports, policy notes, research articles, and published literature. The study finds that the scheme has significantly reduced transportation expenses, increased access to education, healthcare, and employment, and strengthened women's participation in social and economic activities.
